

Director's Message

MEETING ROOMS

I'm excited to share that we'll soon be renovating the last public spaces of the Main Library!

We are enhancing our South Entrance, with upgrades to the entry hall leading to the Meeting Rooms and the Lobby. These changes will make the space more visible, welcoming, and accessible. The Meeting Rooms will also be updated with new tables, chairs and technology for a more comfortable experience.

The dedicated Friends group is also getting an upgrade of their space. The sale area will get a fresh new look, shifting toward a more modern, retail-style setup and the new Friends sort/storage room will help them continue to put on the best books sales in the area.

At the same time, we'll be rolling out RFID (Radio Frequency Identification) technology across all library locations. RFID allows us to automate the check-in process. Which will help reduce the physical strain on staff from heavy lifting and bending and speed up the process of getting returned items back on the shelves. That means more time for staff to focus on providing excellent customer service, and faster access to materials for our members.



To make all of this possible, there will be some temporary adjustments. While the Library will remain open and most services will continue as usual, our public Meeting Rooms will be under construction. As a result, we'll be pausing meeting room reservations from Winter 2025 through Fall 2026.

We appreciate your patience during these upgrades and look forward to welcoming you into an even better Library experience!
