April is National Poetry Month

The Palatine Poet

April is recognized as National Poetry Month, and to our dear librarian, friend, and published author, Tracie Padal, this month holds a special place in her heart.

Tracie has been working at Palatine Library for twenty-six years. She started working at the Library in the summer after graduating from Palatine High School. Every spring she looks forward to coordinating poetry programming, a role she finds very rewarding. Tracie is a local in Palatine, IL, has been living here since she was eight years old, and writes under the pseudonym Tracie Renee.

As a published poet, Tracie has experienced the full creative journey. She was honored to earn a 2025 Highlights Foundation scholarship and win second place in the 2025 Passionfruit Poetry competition while also navigating the many rejections that come with publishing. These experiences ultimately made her stronger, taught her invaluable life lessons, and encouraged her to keep moving forward. This creative journey has helped her connect more with people.

One of Tracie's poems appears in *You're Never Too Much: Poems for Every Emotion*, an anthology for teens edited by Charlie Castelletti. Tracie's love of poetry began with Shel Silverstein and continues today through writers such as Mary Oliver and Ada Limón. When asked how being a poet influences the way she approaches her work at the Library, she mentioned how poetry is a tool for developing empathy



and that it eminently applies when working with the public and being more compassionate.

Tracie credits Palatine Library with shaping her own path as a writer. As a teenager, she frequently checked out *The Poet's Market*, a resource that helped her take her first steps toward publication. Today, she encourages writers to take advantage of the Library's quiet spaces, inspiring collections, and audiobooks.

Aside from our poetry collection, she mentions how she loves novels in verse, which combine storytelling with the emotional power of poetry. Their pages are also less densely packed, which makes them more accessible and appealing to young readers. Beyond that, she encourages poets to listen to audiobooks, because when listening to a story, you begin to understand the cadence of language and how that impacts storytelling.

This National Poetry Month, we invite you to explore our poetry collection, attend a program, or simply spend a quiet moment writing just like Tracie.
