D.I.Y. STEM: SPROUT HOUSE

SUPPLIES

- 4 plain sponges
- scissors
- toothpicks
- hot glue gun (and an adult to help)
- plate

- small paper cups or bowls
- quick-sprouting seeds (wheat berries, chia, or alfalfa)
- water
- paintbrush
- spray bottle



DIRECTIONS

Step 1: Prepare Your Materials

- **a.** Choose one sponge to be the foundation. Lay it flat on the plate.
- **b.** Choose one sponge to be a roof. Cut it in half.
- c. Choose one sponge to be a wall. Cut it in half.
- d. Make additional walls by cutting the last sponge in half, then cutting one half in half again.

Step 2: Build Your House

- a. Use the toothpicks to attach the walls and roof to the foundation.
- b. Have an adult use the glue gun to secure the roof.

Step 3: Plant Your Sprouts

- a. Pour the seeds into small cups, and add a little water to each cup.
- b. Use the paintbrush to cover the sponges with seeds.
- c. Pour water onto the plate, and mist the roof and walls thoroughly with the spray bottle
- d. Water your sprout house 1-2 times daily for the next week, and observe it closely.

Questions for Discovery

- What happens to the seeds?
- Where does the water go?
- Do all the seeds grow at the same rate? Why or why not?
