My first months here at the Library have been very exciting! It's lovely getting to know everyone in the community and hearing your feedback.

Behind the scenes, we've been working hard to improve our services to the community. Our board is embarking on a strategic planning process that will utilize surveys and focus groups to help inform the future direction of our Library. This process is the culmination of work that was already accomplished before I began my role in January.

Planning for the Future

First, the staff conducted a community survey in the fall of 2016 to learn what users and nonusers think about the Library. We gained a great deal of insight into what you (our patrons) want and need, now and in the future.

Next, the board commissioned a capital management study to assess our 26-year-old main Library for upcoming essential maintenance and replacement needs. We know, for instance, that the roof, parking garage, masonry, HVAC, and elevators will all need repair or replacement. The study gives us a road map along with projected expenses of each item for maintaining the building through 2035.

In order to be sure the District can fund all of these needs, the board worked with a financial planning firm to assess our anticipated revenues and expenses. The Financial Plan demonstrates that as our expenses exceed revenues in the next few years, our reserves will not be enough to meet our operating expenses and capital building needs.

In the coming months, look for the board to adopt a strategic plan which will guide us for the future. As always, the trustees, staff, and I are open to hearing your feedback and suggestions for how to move the Library forward.
