Activities

This was a big month for continuing education and professional development at the Library. Four staff members and two trustees were able to attend the <u>Library Journal</u> Design Institute in Austin, TX and bring back ideas for our renovation. Seven staff and two trustees attended the Illinois Library Association Annual Conference in Tinley Park, many of whom presented a program or a poster session. And staff and trustees delved into a variety of webinars on topics related to organizational management for our Illinois State Library Per Capita Grant application.

The management team is taking a hard look at some of our internal processes and structures. For instance, after reading books on effective meetings, the team met to redesign our current meeting structure, to ensure that we are using in-person meeting time efficiently to focus on big picture issues. In addition, the public service department managers are taking a hard look at workload, trying to find ways to quantify and measure work in each department.






